
EAA CHAPTER 166 YOUNG EAGLES RALLY!

EAA 166 RV-12 BUILD UPDATE

update and photos from Rick Montero

The RV-12 Build Team has installed the main wheel fairings and started work on the nose wheel fairing. Work on the tailcone fairing is nearly complete with only nutplate installation remaining to attach the fairing to the tailcone. The team has also started work on the

engine by attaching the mount to the engine. See photos of progress below.

During the next few weeks, the team will complete assembly of the nose wheel fairing, attach the tailcone fairing, and mount the engine to the airframe.


